<p>⁵ Some of Jesus' disciples were remarking about how the temple was adorned with beautiful stones and with gifts dedicated to God. But Jesus said, ⁶ "As for what you see here, the time will come when not one stone will be left on another; every one of them will be thrown down."</p>	<p>In 68 AD the Roman legions surrounded Jerusalem and began a two year siege. By the year 70, the attackers had breached Jerusalem's outer walls and began a systematic ransacking of the city. The assault culminated in the burning and destruction of the Temple. Thousands were slaughtered. The Temple's sacred relics were taken to Rome and put on display. And what will be the sign that they are about to take place?"</p>	<p>From the death of Jesus through the fall of Jerusalem and the crushing of the Jewish Revolt in 73 AD – the first sign was the presence of Jesus Himself among them!</p>	<p>The Rapture begins the time of Great Tribulation, followed by the return of Christ</p> <p>This section is not about Rapture and Tribulation, but about other things.</p>	<p>The Temple has <i>already</i> been destroyed</p>

They are, in fact, part of the natural (sinful) order of things. Remember Ecclesiastes 3 – to everything there is a season, and a time for every purpose under heaven.</p> <p>Sometimes people attribute meaning to these naturally-occurring events when there is no meaning in them. Such people do this with the intention of drawing a following (along with their money). 		<p>Saudi Arabia There is no provision for religious freedom in the constitution of this Islamic kingdom. All citizens must adhere to Islam and conversion to another religion is punishable by death. Public Christian worship is forbidden; worshipers risk imprisonment, lashing, deportation and torture. Evangelizing Muslims and distributing non-Islamic materials is illegal. Muslims who convert to Christianity risk honor killings and foreign Christian workers have been exposed to abuse from employers. http://www.worldwatchlist.us/world-watch-list-countries/saudi-arabia/</p> <p>Eritreia All evangelical churches were closed in 2002 following a government ban on religious groups other than Orthodox, Catholic, Lutheran and Islam. When Christians are discovered they are arrested and held in shipping containers in military camps. The soldiers climbed over heaps of bodies as they chased the fugitives. – Josephus</i></p>	<p>The sequence of events may differ according to the various teachers, but generally Millennial teachings include (1) the Rapture – the sudden removal of all believers in Christ from the earth; (2) the Great Tribulation – a time of terrible worldwide chaos and anarchy; (3) the Return of Christ in Glory; (4) the 1000-year Reign of Christ (the Millennium); (5) the Final Judgment; and (6) believers go to heaven.</p> <p>Amillennial (non-millennial) teachings include (1) the Return of Christ in Glory; (2) the Final Judgment; and (3) Believers live with Jesus in heaven forever</p>

There was no pity for age and no regard was accorded rank; children and old men, laymen and priests, alike were butchered; every class was pursued and crushed in the grip of war, whether they cried out for mercy or offered resistance. - Josephus</i></p>		
<p>There will be great distress in the land and wrath against this people. ²⁴ They will fall by the sword and will be taken as prisoners to all the nations. Jerusalem will be trampled on by the Gentiles until the times of the Gentiles are fulfilled.</p>	<p>In victory, the Romans slaughtered thousands. Of those spared from death: thousands more were enslaved and sent to toil in the mines of Egypt, others were dispersed to arenas throughout the Empire to be butchered for the amusement of the public.</p>

Nation warring against nation and natural disasters on earth are signs that Satan’s occupation of the world is over and the Kingdom of God is coming – hurray!!</p>
